The MYTH of MENTAL ILLNESS

Foundations of a Theory
of Personal Conduct

IN AN ORIGINAL and provocative book, Dr. Szasz argues that the concept of "illness" is scientifically useless when applied to disorders of behavior and orientation. Because psychiatric theories have not taken into account moral issues and normative standards as explicitly stated goals and rules of conduct, the science has divorced itself from precisely that reality which it has tried to describe and explain.

As an alternative he presents a systematic theory of personal conduct, which combines ethical, political, religious, and social considerations with the more traditional concerns of medicine and psychiatry. He describes psychotherapy as "an effective method of helping people—not to get well from an 'illness' but to learn about themselves, others, and life."
